

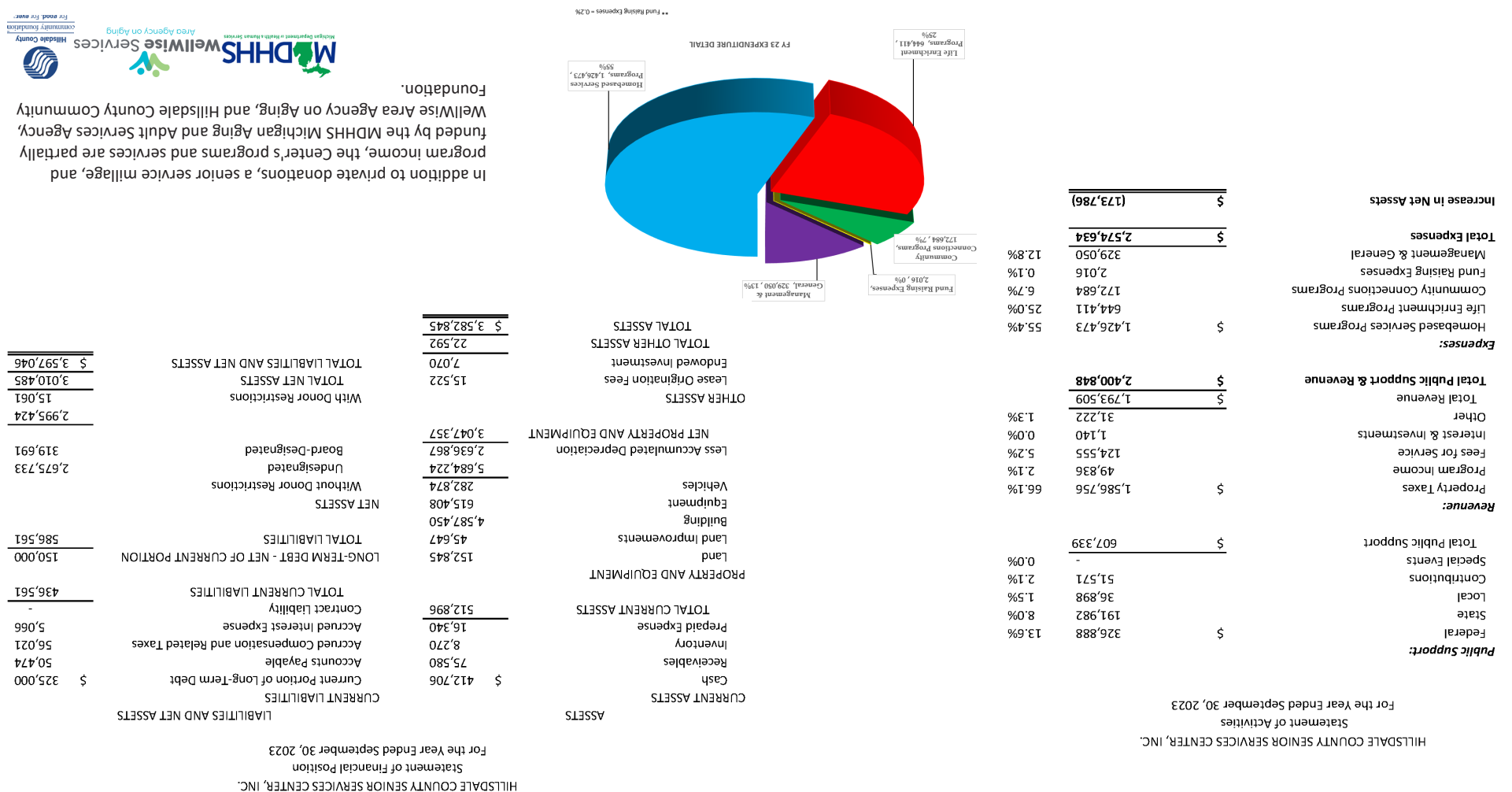

Perennial Park, a 501(c)(3) private nonprofit established in 1983, is crucial in keeping older adults at home, independent, and involved in the community. In 2023, our direct impact was felt by 3,114 unduplicated Hillsdale County residents, representing a significant 35% of those 60 and older in our community. This figure, impressive as it is, does not include the families and friends who were indirectly impacted by the services and programs provided by Perennial Park to their loved ones.

Highlights from Fiscal Year 2023 . . .

(October 1, 2022 - September 30, 2023)



Provided on-site Adult Day Care (Legacy Club) to 25 unduplicated clients and provided At-Home Respite Care to 144 unduplicated clients.

Provided 76,109 meals through Meals on Wheels to 435 unduplicated clients around the county!



We had 133 Volunteers help out at Perennial Park in FY 2023 and we served 149 clients with our Volunteer Transportation service! Volunteer Drivers in our Transportation program drove 42,219 miles while providing non-emergency medical transportation to individuals.

Our Michigan Medicaid Assistance Program (MMAP) helped 110 clients and saved them collectively \$82,260!



Perennial Park received a donation of \$1,000 from Century Bank & Trust to go towards the Center's services and programs.

Our Fitness Center had 17,950 Fit Visits with Cardio Drumming and our SilverSneakers® classes bringing in the most clients!



Perennial Park completed 1,754.5 hours in Outreach! This program aides older adults in finding services and programs within the Center that will help them from support groups to fitness and more!



Over \$14,085 was raised in The Great Give/Giving Day 2022 to go toward the Center's programs and services! Thank you to all who donated and for HCCF for giving us the platform to raise the funds!

Provided 12,224 Congregate Meals to 901 unduplicated clients at Perennial Park. We also served 302 unduplicated clients over 6 different Special Events!



We served 275 clients with our Emergency Shelter service. Perennial Park opened it's doors to those who lost power during the ice storm in February of 2023.
